BLODEUWEDD

Grŵp Blodeuwedd have had a busy few months over the summer and early autumn. One particular project that they have been working on is the building of a mixed shrub & perennial border at Gloddfa Glai bungalows, Talysarn. They planted over 150 small shrubs and trees and are now planning a bulb planting day with volunteers and the young people from Ysgol Talysarn to plant over 500 spring flowering bulbs in and around the new border. Grŵp Blodeuwedd would like to thank all those who helped, especially the young people, Carys Pritchard, Sue Jones, Ysgol Talysarn and Humphrey Jones from Gwynedd Council's Housing Department which supported the programme with a £150 grant.

At the recent Llanllyfni Community Council Garden Competition award evening, Grŵp Blodeuwedd were presented with a special award to recognise their work in the community and received a certificate and £25 in garden vouchers from Fron Goch Garden Centre. PLAS BALADEULYN, FOOTPATH AND LLYN NANTLLE UCHAF

Can we put an end to a recurrent rumour that seems very unwilling to die? It is said that Trigonos has stopped people going down to the lakeside via the path from the road. This has always been untrue. The path is open except during emergencies such as foot & mouth, fallen or dangerous trees and the one day a year required to signify its permitted route status.

The path is a permitted route, not a right of way. It runs through the kissing gate from the main road and down through a small wood to the lakeside. Not being a right of way it is not signposted. When we arrived at Plas Baladeulyn the walk along the lakeside was no more than 100 yards or so to a slate and wire fence that blocked any further progress. About 5 years ago we decided to extend the permitted access further along the lakeside by opening up gateways and placing a slate bridge over the stream, Afon Y Garth. This created a path running about 400 yards along the waterside.

Unfortunately this path does not connect with any other so walkers have to stop at the boundary of the Plas Baladeulyn land and return the way they have come. It is not possible for people to come up through the fields to the Plas itself because that is the centre of our business activity. We ask people to visit the lake via the kissing gate and not through the main entrance to the Plas, to respect the fact that the fields are working farmland with sheep and pastures for cropping, and to keep to the lakeside path. In return Trigonos will be happy to see people continuing to enjoy this wonderful landscape.

AFFORDABLE HOUSING

The Community Land Trust (CLT) has taken a positive step forward in ensuring that affordable housing will be built in the area. With the support of Cist Gwynedd (Gwynedd Council) and the Tudor Trust the CLT have secured funding to employ a development officer for 18 months in order to develop the project.

One of the main sites that the CLT are eager to build on is Gloddfa Glai and it is important that everyone should be aware of, and support, any development on this site.
